

## YOUR WEEKLY UPDATE

1. Does the returns of the plant vary between the use of corn stover and wheat straw?

No - reportedly the cellulosic content of both corn stover and wheat straw is almost identical so the results of the process will yield the same high quality dextrose and co-products regardless of the biomass used.

2. In the end, what do the returns to the member look like?

The member has two sources of returns. The first is when the biomass is transferred to the Co-Op as outlined in their supply contract. The second is as a share of the profits from Comet Sarnia, the production facility which will be owned by the CSPC and Comet Biorefining.

3. What happens if a member cannot supply all of their committed acres for biomass in one season?

By using both corn stover and wheat straw, it is hoped that most if not all members will be able to fill their annual commitment without much issue. To assist this we have established the supply year as starting in September and ending in August so the member can consider corn acres before wheat acres - this was at the request of our members. Field staff will work with each member each year to resolve any supply issues should they arise
